How to get to St. Louis

From the North: Take US-127 about 15 miles south of Mt. Pleasant to the St. Louis exit (127A). Travel two miles east on M-46. Central Business District is left at first stoplight on to North Mill Street.

From the South (Lansing): Take US-127 north about 10 miles from Ithaca. Take the St. Louis exit (124). Go north on State Road about two miles to stop light on M-46. Left at stoplight, then right at next stoplight into Central Business District on North Mill Street.

From the East (Saginaw, Bay City, Midland): Take M-46 west to about seven miles west of Breckenridge. Turn right at the second stop light into the Central Business District on North Mill Street.

From the West (Grand Rapids): Take M-46 east past US-127 about two miles. Turn left at first stoplight into Central Business District on North Mill Street.



The Geographic Center of the Lower Peninsula, St. Louis is located on M-46 just two miles east of US-127 on its Business Route. It is an ideal place to stop whether you're traveling north, south, east or west in our beautiful state!

St. Louis features a good selection of eating places, whether you'd like a sit down meal, a slice of pizza, a sub or sandwich, great ice cream or a cup of coffee and some treats. St. Louis has all of these!

Feel the rugged wood floors beneath your feet and get that old fashioned personal service in places like Peters Hardware and Common Threads. Our three block Central Business District is now on the


National Register of Historic Places and offers great places to buy quality items in restored historic buildings like Flegel Tech Repair, Kubin's Furniture and Uptown Treasures.

St. Louis also offers some interesting history, as the St. Louis Area Historical Society Depot Museum is available for tours by appointment. A statue of a Civil War soldier stands at the intersection of M-46 and North Mill Streets and Council Chambers in our new City Hall is home to 17 full-color paintings of St. Louis historic sites by local artist Mike

Patterson. Paintings are available for viewing during normal business hours.

Recreational opportunities include the Jerry Matthews designed 18-hole Hidden Oaks Golf Course (pictured upper left) that we promise will offer a quality experience. On a hot summer day you'll also find that you can cool off with a trip to the City swimming

pool. Rebuilt in 2005 and located on the north end of downtown, the pool provides a relaxing stop for weary travelers and community members alike. The scenic Pine River runs through town and is a great place for canoeing and fishing.



St. Louis is also on Historic US-27 and is one of the stops on the Old US-27 Motor Tour!
