AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE OPPORTUNITY

Starting in Fall 2016, St. Louis Public Schools partnered with Lansing Community College (LCC) and Gratiot-Isabella RESD to provide American Sign Language (ASL) classes to St. Louis High School students.

These classes have several benefits. Taking two years of ASL fulfills the foreign language credit requirement for high school students. It also provides students with an additional language option for this requirement, when previously they only had the option of taking Spanish. ASL benefits students who would traditionally struggle with Spanish, as ASL has no written form. Additionally, with the partnership with LCC, any junior or senior who obtains 80% or higher in the ASL courses can transfer it to LCC for credit. These students can earn up to 12 LCC credit hours at no charge to them.

Beyond the academic benefits of the ASL courses, there are many social benefits as well. St. Louis houses GIRESD's Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program (DHH). Students with hearing loss, many of whom use ASL to communicate, are in classes with SLHS students every day. More students learning ASL means more hearing students communicating with their DHH classmates. This improves inclusion and socialization for both hearing students and students with hearing loss. ASL students even participate in GIRESD's Singing Hands program each year.

St. Louis students grow up with DHH students and sign language interpreters in their classrooms. Currently, there are three former SLHS students accepted to LCC with the goal to become interpreters. Providing students with training during high school in a career path that could lead them back home to work in St. Louis schools benefits the families, schools, and community of St. Louis.



HEALTHY MEALS A SUCCESS!



It is with a great deal of satisfaction that we were able to provide healthy meals for St. Louis youth for a third summer. We served in three locations again this year. Our three serving sites (St. Louis Community Pool, Clapp Park and the St. Louis Church of God) served a combined daily average of 197 meals. Homeless Notification

The McKinney Vento Act defines homeless families as those families or students that meet one of the following criteria: Any family or youth without a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence is considered "homeless" under the law.

The St. Louis Public Schools has identified Jennifer McKittrick as the Homeless Liaison for the district. The ways in which school homeless liaisons can assist homeless families and youth include:

- Assisting with immediate enrollment in their school;
- Assisting with appropriate services such as transportation, preschool, special education, bilingual services, vocational education, Title I and similar services;
- Make referrals to health care services, dental services, or other care providers;
- Publicly post the education rights of homeless children and youth in places such as schools and family shelters;
- Assist unaccompanied youth with enrollment, transportation and disagreements with schools;
- Assist student with getting immunizations and immunization records;
- Making sure that disagreements between students and schools are always resolved;
- Assisting student with eligibility for free breakfast and lunches.

Pesticide Control Act PA 131

Schools are required to notify parents and guardians of children of their right to be informed prior to any application of a pesticide at the school. Fortunately, we have not been trouble with bug infestations and so do not anticipate a large-scale application of pesticides. However, from time to time we do have to use a pesticide for hornets, ants, and/or bees. We will comply with this law. However, we ask that any parent who wants to be notified regarding limited or routine applications, please contact the building principal's office at your child's school.

Immunization Information

The following is a description of the immunization requirements as set by the Department of Education and the Department of Public Health. All entering students must show evidence of having received two doses of vaccine against measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR), with one dose administered after the age of 15 months unless there is laboratory evidence of immunity. New students are also required to have received the appropriate four doses of vaccine for diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, and polio. All entering students must show a booster dose of diphtheria and tetanus if it has been ten years since the last dose was administered. New students are also required to be vaccinated against Hepatitis B. Three (3) doses are required. When presented with anything but a medical or religious exemption from immunization requirements, the administrator must obtain the consent of the Director of the local Public Health Office to recognize the exemption and admit the student. All parents are encouraged to review their child's immunization records. If the record does not meet the requirements, please contact our family physician or the Local department of Public Health. For new students, the school needs to know if your child has had chickenpox or has been vaccinated for chickenpox.


Federal Regulations Concerning Drug Prevention

In accordance with Federal Law, the Board of Education prohibits the use, possession, concealment, or distribution of drugs by any person on school grounds, in school or school approved vehicles, or at any school-related event. Drugs include any alcoholic beverages, anabolic steroid, dangerous controlled substance as defined by state statute, or substance that could be considered a "look-a-like" controlled substance.

Compliance with this policy is mandatory for all staff members. Any part-time or full-time employee who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action. When appropriate or required by law, the District will also notify law enforcement officials.

Tobacco policy

Michigan law prohibits smoking in all buildings owned by public schools at any time. This includes classroom buildings maintenance garages, and administrative buildings. St. Louis Public Schools' policy does not allow for smoking or tobacco use on district premises at any time. St. Louis Public Schools is a tobacco free zone with a zero tolerance policy.



ANNUAL NOTIFICATIONS

Parents Right to Know

In accordance with ESEA Section 111 PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW, the St. Louis Public School District would like to inform all parents who have a child attending Title I schools, Carrie Knause Early Childhood Learning Center or Nikkari Elementary, of the right to request information regarding the professional qualification of their child's classroom teacher. The following information may answer the questions you have:

1. All of SLPS teachers are deemed Highly Qualified for the area of instruction they are assigned.
2. SLPS does not employ any teaching staff who do not possess a teaching degree for the area they are assigned.
3. All SLPS teachers possess a degree or certification for the area they instruct and for the age level of students they are instructing.
4. All SLPS Instructional Paraprofessionals possess a paraprofessional certificate or meet the required number of hours to be deemed highly qualified.

St. Louis Schools will also notify parents if a child has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher not deemed Highly Qualified. This situation can occur with substitute teachers, who do not possess the correct teacher qualification for the class load they are teaching. SLPS works hard to not allow this to occur, but due to the low number of qualified substitute teachers available it cannot always be avoided.

ATHLETIC INFORMATION

Athletic passes are a great way to attend all of our athletic events without breaking the bank. Stop into the high school athletic office to purchase a family pass for \$225, an adult pass for \$75, or a student pass for \$60. These passes allow admission into any home high school or middle school event, including our own sponsored tournaments. Passes cannot be accepted for MHSAA sponsored events such as districts, regionals, etc.

There is also the option to work for an athletic pass. If you are working for a family pass, the members in your household will have to work a combined total of 18 events or acquire 18 event points. If you are working for an adult pass you will have to work 8 events or acquire 8 event points. Students must work 6 events or acquire 6 event points.

Weekday Event Points:

Concessions=2, Scorebook=1, Scoreboard=1, Tickets=1, Line judges=1, Announcer=1, Track Events=1

Half Day Weekend Event Points:

Concessions=3, Scorebook=2, Scoreboard=2, Tickets=2

Full Day Weekend Event Points:

Concessions=6, Scorebook=4, Scoreboard=4, Tickets=4, Track Events=4

*For the 2017-18 school year, all athletes must have a current physical on file before participating in any practice or contest. Per MHSAA regulations, a current physical is one dated on or after April 15, 2017. Physical cards can be found in the Superintendent's office, High School office, TSN office, and on the athletic website.

*All athletes are required to pay a \$10 Pay-To-Participate fee per sport prior to the first competition. Middle school athletes are capped at \$20 per school year.
