Message from the Mayor



Last month city council approved a \$14 million water main replacement project, though the final commitment hasn't been made.

This job supplements an \$18 million water main project that began last year. That one is paid almost in full by the federal government and should be completed next year. No water rate increase was necessary to pay for it because the feds pick up the tab.

But the bite of the \$14-million project on homeowners is mitigated only by \$5 million of "principal forgiveness" (also from the feds) and easy loan terms of 1 percent over 40 years.

That would result in the average residential water bill rising from \$52 to \$57 per month later this year, a 9 percent increase.

However, residents have a chance to stop it with a petition. If you get 10 percent of the city's 2,900 registered voters to sign a petition by March 30 the bond issue will have to be voted on by y'all.

If that doesn't happen, the city expects to solicit construction bids this summer. City council would then say yea or nay depending on what the bids are. If approved, the project should begin next year and be completed in 2027.

Residents guaranteed to get new water lines in Phase One live on Hebron between Olive and Fairway, Prospect between Teman and Corinth, all of Tamarack, Berea between Tamarack and Prospect, Delaware between North and Crawford, Main Street between M-46 and Center, Mill Street between Hazel and State, Franklin Street between State and Saginaw, E. State Street, East Street between State and Butternut, Butternut Street, Euclid Street and along M-46 between Clinton and Hubbard.

In Phase Two mains would be replaced on Corinth between Olive and Tamarack Prospect between Main and the Wastewater Treatment Plant, Mill Street between M-46 and Crawford Street right-of-way, Crawford Street right-of-way between Mill and Michigan and along Main Street between M-46 and State Street.

There are also valve replacements planned at 15 intersections throughout the system.

Hooray for snow plows!

Thanks to DPW snow plow operators Shawn Felker, Chad Pratt, Ryan Roehrs, Chip Volz, Chase Kral and Water Department workers Brian Henderson and Gregg Austin who kept the streets clear during and after the mid February snow storms. Although there were some water system repairs, too, most of the overtime hours were attributable to snow removal.
