# Message from the Mayor



If you've ever attended a city council meeting you probably noticed that most of us on the dais have an Apple iPad tablet computer in front of us.

Perhaps you've wondered what we're looking at on these devices. I know I always did when I was on the outside looking in.

Well, everyone has the most recent board meeting packet on their screen. This includes itemized spending (everything from payroll to office supplies), meeting minutes from other boards and commissions, monthly reports for each city department head and background information on every agenda item. It generally runs to 100 pages or more. (The June 17 packet was 169 pages.)

Confidential information, right? Nope. Anyone with an internet connection can see everything we see on our tablets.

Our administrators are good at collecting background data on everything before us at each meeting and putting it in this packet.

For example, the packet for the June 17 meeting included reports on code enforcement, cemetery burials, police doings, activity in the Water, Electric and Public Works departments and background for eight agenda items.

If you'd like to see what we see, start at the city web site and use the Government tab at the top to navigate to the city council page. Scroll down when you arrive and look under the Documents heading. The first item will be City Council Packets. Click on that and you'll see a list of documents you can download. The packets for each meeting are usually available on the Friday afternoon before each meeting.

Then you will have all the information that we on city council have in front of us at each meeting. It's a great resource, and I thank city staff and administrators for putting it together. Have a look and see what you think.

City Council Meetings are the first and third Tuesday of every month at 6 p.m.
