 for blood draws for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The online service was costly and at this

 condition that presents with psychomotor agitation, delirium, and sweating. It may include attempts at violence,

 potassium. The online training covered 3 major areas of concern for law enforcement:
 - o Findings from a recent comprehensive study examining over 9,000 use of force incidents
 - A simple assessment tool to help officers identify the possibility of ExDS
 - Law enforcement officer actions that can help avoid injuries and more effectively subdue ExDS subjects involved in a violent episode


