How to get to St. Louis

From the North: Take US-127 about 15 miles south of Mt. Pleasant to the St. Louis exit (127A). Travel two miles east on M-46. Central Business District is left at first stoplight on to North Mill Street.

From the South (Lansing): Take US-127 north about 10 miles from Ithaca. Take the St. Louis exit (124). Go north on State Road about two miles to stop light on M-46. Left at stoplight, then right at next stoplight into Central Business District on North Mill Street.

From the East (Saginaw, Bay City, Midland): Take M-46 west to about seven miles west of Breckenridge. Turn right at the second stop light into the Central Business District on North Mill Street.

From the West

(Grand Rapids): Take Driving times to St. Louis: M-46 east past US-127 From: about two miles.Turn Marquette. left at first stoplight Grand Rapids .. into Central Business Traverse City... District on North Mill Mackinac Bridge Street. Lansing.. Midland.. Detroit....
